BOA K-5 Return to In-Person Learning Update (4/19/2021)

Belmont Oaks Academy has implemented all health and safety guidelines stipulated by San Mateo County Health and San Mateo County Office of Education in accordance with the Pandemic Recovery Framework and its most recent update dated April 6, 2021.

On Monday, April 19, 2021 Belmont Oaks Academy welcomed back all our elementary students for full day, in-person instruction, 5 days per week, thereby eliminating the hybrid model the School had been following since 9/21/2020. Although we continue to offer 100% distance learning for the remainder of the school year, only a handful of families have chosen this option.

Belmont Oaks Academy will continue to diligently follow the Four Pillars and continue practicing all our designated health and safety protocols as detailed in our School's Re-Opening Plan. Additionally, as submitted to San Mateo County Health, the School affirms that the following will continue or become part of our plan for in-person learning beginning Monday, April 19, 2021 and continue through the end of the academic school year on Friday, June 11, 2021:

- Disinfection will not occur when students are present.
- All students and staff will continue to screen daily for symptoms of and exposure to Covid-19 prior to entering the school campus.
- School staff and students in grades K-5 will be required to wear a well-fitted face covering at all times while at school, unless exempted.
- Student chairs are spaced three feet apart in all classrooms.
- All adults will maintain six feet of physical distance from other adults and students, when practicable, except when working with students side-by-side as necessary.
- Students remain six feet apart when eating and drinking.
- The School continues to follow the testing and contract tracing in our re-opening plan as in accordance with the guidance from San Mateo County Health.
- In the event of a surge in Covid-19 case rates and positivity rates, the School will implement stricter guidance as determined by State and local public health officials.
- MMBOA will continue to follow all other provisions in the Pandemic Recovery Framework.
